## **OLCAA's 8th Annual Blood Drive**

This drive is being held in December since blood donations are usually low during this season when people are busy with holiday preparations. As you have probably heard, blood donations are needed now to help victims of the hurricane and flooding in Texas. You can donate now and in December since you can safely donate blood every 56 days.

At the same time, we are holding a coat drive during these hours to collect gently worn coats, hats, scarves, etc. for needy families being serviced by the Germantown Avenue Crisis Ministry. Any style, any size, adult or children can be donated. We have collected a minimum of 150 coats each year so we know we have made the holiday a little brighter for some of our neighbors.

The American Red Cross is attempting to make blood donation quicker and easier with its RapidPass program. New this year, donors can complete their pre-donation reading and health history questions on your mobile device as well as on your computer, at your convenience, on the day of donation. This activity will generate a pass you print out or send to your smart phone and bring along to the donation center. This shortens their donation process at the center.
